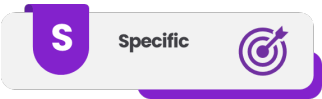
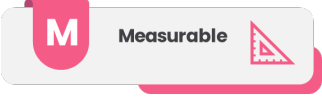
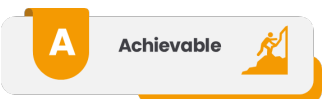
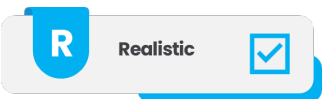
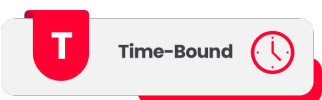


SMART IEP Goal Graphic Organizer

SMART Component	Definition	Plan (Examples)
 S Specific	Specific language that includes that behavior / area / skill / condition	
 M Measurable	Measurable language that includes both clear criteria for data collection and the method progress monitoring	
 A Achievable	Attainable tasks aligned to the level and needs of the student that can be achieved within the specific time frame	
 R Realistic	Relevant information that aligns with the long- term objectives for the student and aligns with his or her current unique needs	
 T Time-Bound	A realistic endpoint for the goal to be realistically achieved	
SMART GOAL:	Combine all the SMART components together into one clear SMART Goal
